Dear Parents,

We have successfully completed the last round of MAP testing for the year, and while we do not yet have the results for this last set of MAP tests I can report to you some very good news regarding our MAP testing results.

In late March, we hired the services of a data consultant that has experience working in other international schools. Cameo Analytics reviewed ISPS' MAP data from Fall 2014 through to Winter of 2018-19, 5 years of data.

The Findings of the report are: "Students taking the NWEA Map assessment at ISPS consistently score well on percentile rank, RIT and conditional growth, as compared to NWEA Map norms. For the last three years, ISPS has had an average RIT higher than the average AASSA group for all grades and in all subjects. For example, using percentile rank for the Fall 2018-19 assessment, 84.2% of test takers scored above the 50th percentile in Language, 77.2% of test takers scored above the 50th percentile in Mathematics and 77.5% of test takers scored above the 50th percentile in Reading."

The reference to AASSA group is a comparison to other international schools in the region that belong to the Association of American Schools in South America who also use the MAP testing.

The report is 21 pages of data analysis does point to some specific Grade levels that should be monitored in a specific area (reading for example) and that will

be part of our improvement plan for next year.

On a completely different note, we have been notified by T&TEC that we will be without power on the 31st of May. They are finishing the job that they began the last time we had a power outage. As there will be no electricity, school will be closed on the 31st.

As we get into the last 5 weeks of school, we have several weeks which are broken by public holidays. Please emphasize with your children the importance of staying focused on academics and attendance is an important part of that. In addition, the last day of school is June 28th and we would like all children to experience the awards ceremonies that take place on that day. Please resist the temptation of pulling your children out early.

This weekend we have 15+ HS students, as well as staff members, participating in Project Care. The two day project will be refurbishing a school in downtown Port of Spain. While the physical work will finish on Sunday, many of our students have projects going at ISPS in order to raise money for Project Care. Those fundraising events will continue for several weeks and the MS Student Council has set a goal of raising 10,000TT\$. Please consider supporting those fundraising events.

The second day of the tournament teams split into Doubles partners and matches were Doubles games up to 11 points. The teams won their next set of games against St. Monica's 11/6 and 11/9. However, lost against a strong Point Fortin R.C. Preparatory School 3/11 and 5/11. ISPS B finished third in their group.

The Green Dot Division team consisted of Alex and Julian Rampaul, Siem Zandvliet, Oliver Eaton and Gabriella Sabeeney. There were four other teams in ISPS' group with Tobago as their first opponent. Doubles Teams of Siem/Julian and Ollie/Alex had a couple of competitive games but lost both 13/15 and 6/15 respectively. The teams then split their games against St. Andrew's Preparatory School with Siem/Julian winning 15/10 and Gabriella/Alex losing a close 15/16 game. They went on to better results with Siem/Julian and Ollie/Alex winning both games 15/10 and 15/6 respectively. But then split their last set of games against Dunross Preparatory School with Siem/Julian and Ollie/Gabriella finishing 15/4 and 2/15 respectively. ISPS finished 3rd in their group and advanced to the B Division

However, ISPS came back in the 3rd Place Match against Tobago splitting their games 21/8 and 15/21 finish third in the division.
