Hosay's Bitter History

Hosay, the Shi'ite Muslim commemoration of the martyrdom of Mohammed's grandsons, Hassan and Hussein, is currently going on. It began September 10. This is a beautiful and moving ceremony that no one living in Trinidad should miss.


Hosay takes place in two places: St. James and Cedros. It usually starts about 8 --10 pm at night on the main street in St James. The last day begins between 10 am to noon in St James and includes a march to QRC.

The Structure of Hosay

- 1. First Night: Hosay begins with flag night -- The tssa drums play hand (rhythm), which is the call to battle. Flags are paraded through the street.
- 2. Night two: The small tadjah (tomb) representing Hassan is paraded through the streets.
- 3. Night three: The larger tadjahs are paraded through the streets.
- 4. Fourth night: Men in stockinged feet "dance the moon", a green one representing Hassan and a red one representing Hussein. The two moons meet in the middle of the street. Four of the hands have played by now including the call to battle. This is the only night the fifth hand, the mourning rhythm plays.
- 5. On the fifth day, there is a parade through the main road in St James to the sacred Hosay ground which is located inside the Queen's Royal College (QRC) grounds, which was given by the queen of England as a holy ground. There, the moons are planted in the ground.
- 6. he sixth day. Some time early in the morning the tadjahs a re taken to the sea in Cedros where they are destroyed so that the souls of Hassan and Hussein can return to the Tigris and Euphrates Rivers.



AP STUDENTS

Charting a Path to College Credit





RICHARD SIEUNATH, AP COORDINATOR grsieunath@isps.edu.tt The AP® Program has introduced for the 2019-20 school year new resources and processes designed to help students earn college credit and placement. At ISPS students have already started participating in the new process by signing up online with the CollegeBoard for each AP class they are taking. Students will get personalized feedback through new digital tools that provide daily support for every AP classroom. Their teachers will be able to track their performance throughout the year using monthly personal progress checks.

Here's some additional information you and your student need to know:

- Students will be asked to register for AP Exams in the fall. AP Exams will continue to be given in May.
- The exam fee isn't changing. However, there will be a \$40 fee for late registration (after Nov. 15) and a \$40 cancelation or unused exam fee.
- The AP Exam Registration form will be distributed on HS Curriculum Night. It is to be filled out and signed by both parent and student. The form is to be returned to the Business Office together with the exam fees by October 4, 2019.
